After the resounding success of the My tree initiative at Aravalli Biodiversity Park, Gurugram, Uttar Pradesh will be re-charged with 3 forthcoming projects:

- **Ganga Haritma Abhiyan** - The Satsang Foundation will be planting 100,000 trees along the Ganga river at Garh Mukhteswar, adjacent to the historic Hastinapur Forest. An underground feeder stream will be revived as part of recreating a wetland forest area. Local bodies join hands with us towards this initiative.
- **Agra Ecozone** - An abandoned landfill shall be rejuvenated in the heart of Shahdara Distt by planting 20,000 plants constituting 2500 trees along with shrubs and grasses will create many new usable spaces.
- **Greening of Banaras ghats**- A project to create green cover on the ghats still in its nascent stages.



Babaji used to say, ‘The seeds have been planted, they have been sown but no seed will become a tree and bear fruit in three days, it takes its own time’. So sow the seed, keep the climate clear, water it properly and then we’ll see what happens.

## Projects in Pipeline for 2018-19

### Satsang Swasthya Kendra

**Rural Mobile Medicare Program:** We intend to reach out to 8 nearby villages on an average of 10-km-radius with the intention of rendering screening, diagnostic, treatment, of rehabilitative, training and awareness services through integrative and holistic programs.

**Swaasthya Hospitals :** The Satsang Swasthya Kendra plans to expand its existing service and provide round the clock medical care. This facility would be available to deserving to cater to the short admission requirements with basic facilities like emergency, radiology, and basic laboratory.

**Skill Development Centre :** In tie-up with National Skill Development Council (NSDC) a skill development center is praposed to be setup with an aim to provide employment to the unemployed youth in and surrounding villages and with a special focus on those unable to pass their Secondary and Senior Secondary Examinations (Class 10 & 12). This will aslo provide an alternative path to students of Satsang Vidyalaya, whereby they can join SSDC after finishing class 10 at SV.

To begin with, we will place them in the services industry : Retail, Health and Wellness, Hospitality and Data Processing as there is a huge demand in these sectors for skilled personnel.

**A Study Center at Chowdepalle :** As per the vision Sri M., a study center is comming up at Chowdepalle. It will also have an amphitheater and goshala in the near future.

**Satsang Vidyalaya Primary School :** Considering the increasing demand at the Satsang Vidyalaya a new block is proposed to be constructed for the primary school.

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## Chanda Satsang Vidyalaya, Lathira



The Chanda Satsang Vidyalaya addresses the urgent need in Lathira, Uttar Pradesh, about 120 Kms from Gurugram. Although initially it was to be a small 20-children school, the actual enrollment surpassed more than 50! With the support of Dr (Late) Chanda and Anil Seth, the school started on July 1st, 2017 with 14 children in Nursery and 51 in the learning Centre across grades. It has now received certification to operate as a Primary School under the UP board from this Academic Year i.e.2018-2019. Continuing with Sri M’s philosophy free meals, uniforms & medicine are provided to all the children.



A month long Hygiene drive was run for children where they were taught to bathe, comb, clean and use the toothbrush. Older children were guided in good practices of grooming and personal hygiene. This will be repeated periodically to instill a discipline of hygiene.



Chanda Vidyalaya was visited by Peepal Baba who sensitized the children on planting, environment and a holistic approach to farming. Fruit trees like Pomegranate, Chikoo, Mango, Guava were chosen and planted by the children who will be nurturing them to maturity. MyTree team led the project for planting different trees by each child. Children were excited about their plants that first thing they do after coming to school is to run to their tree with a mug of water to check them and water it. With onset of monsoons plants are back in full glory. During the winter Sri M. had aslo visited the school.

Chanda Vidyalaya has opened school on 2nd July after a month long summer break. We have 70 children enrolled in primary school and 12 in learning centre. Chanda Satsang Vidyalaya will keep enrolment open for the month of July.
